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5 **Mkhwanazi:** Well, I have not necessarily got the briefing in details from intelligence in that regard. I've heard the talks about it. I don't have the full briefing. What is of interesting is that, he's got citizenship in three countries, and that makes me wonder. And he seems to have been a person, who got angry when he was disturbed by being removed from the ports of entry in South Africa, the main port of entry at the time, which was
10 Johannesburg International Airport. And when he was removed, he did not take that kindly. So, it will make me conclude that there were some things that were happening in that airport that made him angry.

Malema: So, will be correct to say Mr. Paul O'Sullivan is one of the "rogue elements" that are destabilising SAPS and wanting to capture every senior police officer at
15 SAPS, and if you don't cooperate, he start engaging in blackmailing activities?

Mkhwanazi: With no doubt. I'm going to invite the parliament through the structures of intelligence or structures of security and whoever structures you can come up with, to look at the time of Mr. Robert McBride's tenure as the head of IPID, how they were interacting with Paul O'Sullivan. Bank movements, money movements, the meeting
20 venues, the cell phone locations where they meet, how they engage in terms of investigation. I'm saying this to the members because it is that which Mr. Nkabinde told me, who is now a chief of staff at the office of the minister, that operations of IPID were "planned, coordinated, and executed" at Robert – at Paul O'Sullivan's house. That was his words to me.

25 So, I'm going to require – request that such be investigated in detail because the phone will put McBride in this place. Will put Paul O'Sullivan in this place. Will put Nkabinde in this place and others. And when that investigation is conducted, nobody can deny it, because we'll know exactly that all of them have been operating guided by Paul O'Sullivan.

5 And that is on one side. And I'm interested to know, honourable members, as to who is the author of the report that led – that was produced when the City of Johannesburg, as well as the national commissioner wrote to the state security, asking them about the legality, or otherwise of the gadget that were bought by the City of Johannesburg, at the time when General Sibiya was in charge of the security in that place. And who is the company that
10 supplied that gadget? And how was that gadget sourced from the country in Europe where it comes from, in the UK? And I want to also recommend an investigation, against the purchase of a similar gadget, that was bought by DPCI back in **2010**, where General Sibiya was working at DPCI at the time, whether such was bought legally, who are the supplier and who's the manufacturer of the things?

15 And I'll want the parliament to check every financial records of Mr. Paul O'Sullivan and all the individuals I've mentioned, and so that we're able to trace and draw conclusion, whether is Paul O'Sullivan a clean man or is an agent. So, I think based on that investigation, will be able to conclude whether, is he indeed a clean man, or, he is what is been said in public, "an agent." If he's a clean man, why he does what he does? If he's an
20 agent, who is he working for?

But, it is time that this country must not sit back and be run by Mr. Paul O'Sullivan. And if government fails to act on it, the men and women in this country, they're going to take it upon themselves to do something drastically on it. And it might not be what this government wants to do, because he has gone too deep, in showing that he's got control
25 all over.

And maybe lastly I might ask the members to say, if you ever heard of any report that is deemed to be classified, that's supposed to expose the wrong that has happened, that such reports been interrogated. And one of them, IPID has a responsibility to investigate criminal things. When you hear the minister of police says, I've got a report from IPID that

5 is classified. Then you need to ask yourself a question. You are not an intelligence structure. What do you do with a classified report that you don't want to release? As IPID, what is that report doing in the minister, for first place? Because IPID deals with the criminal case docket. Whatever you investigate must get into the case docket and that docket must go to court. Why will it go to the minister and the minister goes out public and
10 say, I've classified this report, I won't make it public? So, these are the things that need to be checked, because it is when the system of government fails and you have worked hard to create a legislation to try and protect yourselves, the citizen of the republic, but if it's manipulated in that fashion that the minister can just decide, I'm classifying this, I'm not releasing it in public. Perhaps, you need to ask, do you minister, that classifies a
15 document, do you have a security clearance yourself?
