

SWORN STATEMENT

I, the undersigned [REDACTED] Czech Passport Number [REDACTED] state under oath in English (the contents hereof having been fully interpreted to me in Czech by a qualified Interpreter Mrs Eva Motyckova in Prague) as follows:

1

I make this statement freely, voluntarily and without any undue influence in accordance with section 204 of the Act. Further, insofar as it may be necessary, subject to the provisions of section 105A of the Act; having been informed that my statement may incriminate me in various offences and notwithstanding the aforesaid, I may be called as a witness on behalf of the prosecution and further be required to answer questions which may incriminate me. However, if in the opinion of the court, I am found to have answered all questions frankly and honestly I will be discharged from prosecution on such charges or any competent verdict thereon. Further that the contents hereof may not be utilised in any manner or be regarded as admissible evidence in any trial against me.

I am a Czech citizen and am currently living in Prague. I was during the period of September 2010 until 2012-02-03 living in South Africa and during that period I was working for Radovan Krejcir ('Krejcir'). I left South Africa, because I could see that Krejcir was getting involved in so much criminal activity that, sooner or later, I would be dragged into it and even possibly murdered, like so many of his other 'associates'. As a consequence of my working for Krejcir, I had intimate knowledge of some of his criminal dealings. Krejcir would communicate with me directly face to face, or via telephone from his phone on number 071 700 0000 to my phone, I had many telephone numbers but I cannot now remember what they were.

I had been in South Africa only a few months, and had realised who this Krejcir person was in South Africa. I knew him from the Czech Republic, but he wasn't such a big shot there, not like the big psychopath he became in South Africa. I soon realised he was a dangerous man and would kill everyone who crossed him. Krejcir would make many deals with people but would not give them their money back and would threaten to kill them or even have them killed. There are many people who he wanted to kill in South Africa, he told me who they are. Some of them are already dead.

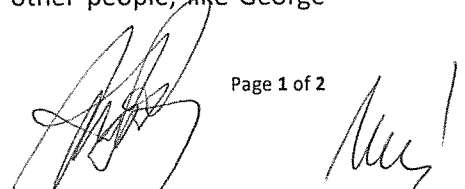
This statement deals with Paul O'Sullivan's ('O'Sullivan') telephone records getting into the possession of Krejcir.

Krejcir got O'Sullivan's telephone records for March, April and May of 2011 from this white guy whose wife or sister works at Vodacom or somewhere. I don't know this guy but I have a photo of him, I could identify him if I saw him. There was a picture in the Newspaper where Katrina comes to Krejcir's Court hearing in Johannesburg in a bulletproof car, it was a Mercedes, he is in that picture, he is the bodyguard with the glasses. His brother was with him and his brother has a tattoo but I don't recall if it is on one arm or both arms. His brother does not look like the guy with glasses, he looks more like a gangster, compared to his brother. His brother said he has a body guard company and has knowledge about guns.

Krejcir gave me the phone records for me to analyse for him. I can remember from the phone records O'Sullivan's phone calls to the Czech Republic, or from Czech Republic, to America and to England. I also remember seeing calls made to Jerome Safi ('Safi'), and other people, like George



Mihalivic. I analysed who O'Sullivan spoke with before the raid, on the day of the raid and a few days after the raid. Then Krejcir ran the numbers on his own phone to see who O'Sullivan had been calling. Then we went and met with Ian Small-Smith at some café and Ian Small-Smith had the cell-phone records in front of him and started putting the numbers into his phone to see if he could also identify some numbers. Ian Small-Smith identified General Sibiya on the day of the raid. Other people helped, but I do not now recall who they were.

I found a picture with this guy in it, which I got from the internet. It's one of the pictures of Krejcir outside court. The red arrow points at this guy.

Krejcir was more interested in the phone numbers in the Czech Republic. He told me that he found out that the number belonged to a journalist.

Prior to me signing this statement, I have carefully read through it and am satisfied that the facts are correctly and accurately recorded. The following questions were put to me in person by the commissioner of oaths and I entered the answers thereto in my own handwriting:

'Do you know and understand the contents of this statement?'

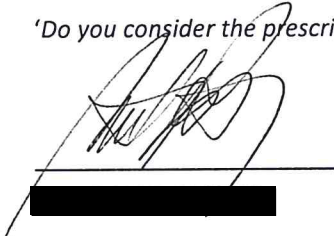
